



Need Assistive Technology? Funding Sources Through North Dakota Assistive Can Help

Explore six funding options that can help North Dakotans access the tools they need.

Assistive Technology Financial Loan

Low-interest (2%) loan program for individuals with lower incomes or poor credit, specifically for assistive technology needs. Common uses include adaptive vehicles, home modifications and hearing aids. Learn More: <http://ndassistive.org/financialloan/>

Telephone Equipment Distribution Service (TEDS)

Also known as the Specialized Telephone Program, TEDS provides free communication devices to eligible individuals who meet income guidelines. Devices include amplified phones, large button phones, phone dialers, simplified cell phones, mounting systems. Learn More: <http://ndassistive.org/specialized-phone-program/>

iCanConnect/Deaf/Blind Program

Provides assistive technology for individuals with combined vision and hearing loss who meet income guidelines. Common tools include computers, smart devices, and alerting systems for communication and daily living. Learn More: <http://ndassistive.org/icanconnect/>

Assistive Safety Device Distribution Service (Senior Safety)

Free safety devices for individuals 60+ living independently (not in a nursing facility). Includes items like pendant alert systems, grab bars, medication reminders, and alarms. Full list on the application page. Learn More: <http://ndassistive.org/senior-safety-program/>

Possibility Grant

A grant of up to \$2,000 for assistive technology when no other funding options (like insurance or waivers) are available. Intended as a last-resort funding source. Learn More: <http://ndassistive.org/possibilitiesgrant/>
