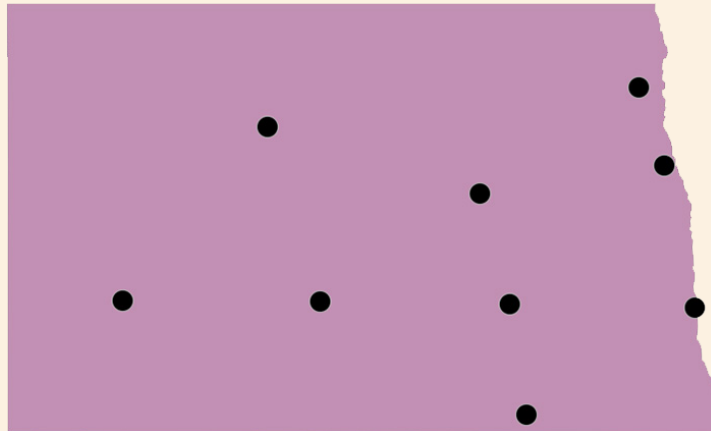

What's New?

Disability Rights North Dakota (DRND), the Protection & Advocacy agency in North Dakota, began their sixth year of monitoring representative payees in 2023. At the start of the program year, they began conducting reviews with an updated and streamlined business process. DRND's team conducted **9** payee interviews and **58** interviews with beneficiaries, legal guardians, and third parties. Based on their findings, P&A reviewers provided **1** referral to connect payees and beneficiaries to additional resources. The payees who participated in reviews served **423** total beneficiaries, reflecting a total number of beneficiaries impacted.

1 Referral to Community Resources

DRND's Rep Payee team provided 1 referral so that beneficiaries could access services unique to their support needs and to enhance their quality of life. For example, DRND provided the following:

- **1 ABL Account Referrals** were made to help beneficiaries to save money without affecting their benefits. An ABL account is a savings and/or investment option for people with disabilities to use their funds to pay for qualified expenses.
